Jazz Power Initiative

Jazz Power Initiative (JPI, a dba of The Jazz Drama Program), a non-profit, 501 (c) (3) organization founded in 2003, serves thousands of New Yorkers and visitors annually – students, teachers, artists, seniors and general audiences, ages 8–80+, to promote music education, and build more creative and inclusive communities through jazz music, theater and dance education and performance.

Jazz Power Youth Program

Jazz Power Initiative's music education program centers African American vocal traditions supported by healthy functional voice training and piano keyboard musicianship combined with theatre and movement for an immersive and transformational learning experience. Our holistic, crosscultural, and multidisciplinary approach to jazz music and arts education activates an inclusive atmosphere that fosters teamwork, self-discipline and creative expression. African American and Latino cultural foundations of jazz arts guide our process, including the models of excellence we provide the children, the background of our faculty, the repertoire we select, the communities we serve, and the "Jazz Power Tools" we teach such as improvisation, making a soulful sound, call and response, syncopation, and swing. Students are given ongoing opportunities to perform with professional artists and present their talents in a wide variety of venues including presentations of Jazz Power musicals for youth performers.

Zah! Jr.

Zah! Jr. is Jazz Power Initiative's advanced youth ensemble composed of 8-10 youth ages 10-16 who have completed at least one year of training with JPI. Zah! Jr rehearses weekly under the guidance of theatre director Kena Onyejekwe and Artistic Director, Dr. Eli Yamin, receiving professional training in voice and theatre in preparation to perform classic blues and jazz repertoire by artists such as Robert Johnson, Big Mama Thornton, Celia Cruz, Duke Ellington and Ella Fitgerald along with originals in the tradition from Jazz Power musicals written for youth performers. Throughout the year, Zah! Jr. gains valuable performance experience accompanied by professional jazz musicians, at a variety of NYC venues including the National Jazz Museum in Harlem, Alianza Dominicana Cultural Center, the United Palace, Jazzmobile/ Summerstage, Car Free Earth Day with NYC Department of Transportation, Bank Street School For Children and the Jazz Power Festival Uptown! in NYC Parks. Members of Zah! jr become ambassadors of jazz to our uptown communities of Washington Heights, Harlem and Inwood, while gaining artistic, leadership and life skills and making positive connections with peers and others in the community modeling a life of joy and fulfillment.
